



## What do I need to do next?

- Register**  You need to make sure you are registered for classes:
1. You can register on your own, *online*, after your advising appointment, by going to [www.ualr.edu](http://www.ualr.edu) and logging onto BOSS.
  2. Your academic advisor may help you register.
  3. Your academic advisor may put your schedule on a worksheet and tell you that a copy of your schedule will be mailed to you within one week of your advising appointment.
- Placement Tests**  If you are eligible for Accuplacer placement tests (Math, Reading, Composition) and want to take them, go to the Office of Testing Services, Ross Hall 409, Monday through Friday between 8:30 a.m. and 3:00 p.m. You should call ahead to ensure that you can test that day (569-3198). The charge is \$10 per test, payable by check or money order made out to UALR. Photo I.D. is required.
- Orientation**  Attend *New Student Orientation* on Friday, July 21; Tuesday, August 8; and Wednesday, August 23. Contact the Office of Campus Life at 569-3308 to sign up.
- Fee Payment**  *Early Registration:* Friday, August 11, 5:00 p.m. is the last day to pay the \$100 deposit, full fees, or have confirmed financial aid for students who register by August 11.
- Regular Registration:* Friday, August 25, 5:00 p.m. is the last day to pay for Fall 2006 without a late payment fee.
- Classes Begin**  Fall 2006 classes begin on Monday, August 28.
- I.D.'s**  After you register for classes, have your student I.D. made at the Fitness Center (569-8284) on the lower level of the Donaghey Student Center.
- Parking Permit**  After registering, obtain a parking permit at the Department of Public Safety (569-3408).
- Bookstore**  The UALR Bookstore (569-3245) is located on the lower level of the Donaghey Student Center. Take a copy of your schedule with you to help find the books you need. Bookstore staff is available to help you locate books.
- Disability Support Services**  Contact Disability Support Services (569-3143) if you need to request services. Interpreters and books in alternative format require weeks of advance notice. Course waivers in math, language, music, and art requirements may be possible for some students.
- E-mail**  Student UALR e-mail accounts are created within 24 hours of registration. Your e-mail address can be found on BOSS under the *Personal Information* section. E-mail serves as an official means of communication with students and may include financial aid information, e-bills (invoice) and payment deadlines, and registration information. Students are responsible for regularly reading e-mail messages. The UALR e-mail system can be accessed at <http://mail.ualr.edu>. Your password is your I.D. #.
